Salaries will be in accordance with current negotiated CUPE2278 rates. Students registered full-time in a Master's or PhD program may apply.

Teaching Assistant duties may include teaching, holding regular office hours, marking subjective assignments and exams, exam invigilation, attending orientation meetings as well as follow-up sessions, where applicable; preparation and involvement in seminars, lectures, discussion periods and tutorials. Rate of pay as of September 1, 2021 is \$35.13 per hour for GTA 1 and \$33.80 per hour for GTA 2. A GTA 1 is a graduate student who has completed 2 years' services as a graduate student teaching assistant. A GTA 2 is a graduate student with less than 2 years of service as a graduate student teaching assistant. All positions are subject to enrolment and funding.
